Signs and Symptoms of an Opioid Overdose



Breathing is slow, shallow, or gone



You can hear snoring or gurgling



Pupils are small



Skin feels cold or clammy



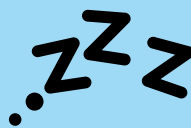
Feelings of dizziness, confusion, or extreme tiredness



Fingernails turn blue or purplish-black



Lips turn blue or purplish-black



Person is unconscious or can't be woken up

Responding to an Opioid Overdose

- 1 Shout their name and shake their shoulders
- 2 Call 911 if unresponsive
- 3 Give naloxone
- 4 Perform rescue breaths and/or chest compressions
- 5 Repeat steps 3 & 4 if there is no improvement after 2-3 minutes
