Animal vaccinations are up-to-date, signed by a licensed veterinarian and available on-site.  Birthing areas should be restricted to the public.  Animals that are too young to be vaccinated for rabies are not accessible to the public Process in place for animals who are ill or injured at the time of the event Process in place to report any animal bite to the Grand Erie Public Health Process in place for the cleaning of the animal enclosure Protective equipment (such as helmets) are available where required If dirtied, equipment should be washed and sanitized with a bleach solution.
